All other special meetings will be advertised in a local newspaper at least 24 hours prior to the meeting in *accordance with the state Sunshine Law.*

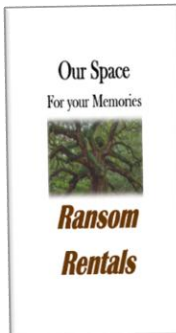

RANSOM TOWNSHIP



Ransom Township originated in 1849 from Exeter and Newton townships and was named in honor of Captain Samuel Ransom who raised a company in 1777 for the defense of the Wyoming Valley and fell in the Wyoming Massacre of 1778. The township's pioneer settler, John Gardner, was also Lackawanna County's first settler.
